

1) Cremant de Bourgogne, Cave de Lugny, Brut Rose, France - Dry, crisp, elegant with excellent acidity and pretty fruit.

This delightful Rosé sparkling wine comes from Burgundy. It is made of 80% Pinot Noir, and 20% Gamay Noir. The charming eye of the swan color comes from the addition of Pinot Noir to the wine when the lees are disgorged, following the traditional fermentation in the individual bottle, in the champagne method. On the palate it is very rich and fruity but just off-dry on the finish. The mousse is explosive, with a very creamy palate impression. It shows just a hint of the earthiness of a Pinot Noir from Burgundy.

2) Greco di Tufo dei Feudi di San Gregorio, '07, Italy - A mineral driven typical Greco. Bright citrus and great acidity

This wine is made from the vine of the same name imported to Italy by the Greeks. The historic writer Columella described it as "Aminea Gemina" referring to its twin grape clusters. The vine, aboriginal of the Tessaglia, was spread in Campania by the Pelasgi, who diffused the first cultivation in the province of Naples, on the slopes of the Vesuvio, and subsequently in some zones of the province of Avellino, in particular Tufo, the rich of sulphur soil of which resulted adapt to the cultivation of such a vine.

3) Mulderbosch, Faithful Hound, '06, South Africa - A Bordeaux blend of grapes resulting in a wine with black fruit, black currants, good acidity and fine tannins.

Mulderbosch Faithful Hound is a Bordeaux-style red blend of 42% Merlot, 36% Cabernet Sauvignon, 8% Malbec, 8% Petit Verdot and 6% Cabernet Franc. It is deep ruby red in color with a nose of strawberry, black currant spice and oak. It is dry and mellow, medium/full in body, with a nice touch of oak. The wine's rich flavors of plums, blackberries and vanilla are well balanced with its soft tannins. On the finish, it is long and pleasing.

4) Catena, Malbec, '07, Argentina - 100% Malbec. This is a ripe wine showing black cherry fruit, excellent balance and structure.

With grapes sourced from different microclimates from different altitudes to accentuate the unique Argentinian terroir, this is benchmark Malbec made by the Catena family, whose name is synonymous with quality. Showing ripe blackberry and blackcurrant fruit flavours, subtle vanilla oak and plenty of peppery spice balanced by firm tannins and crisp, refreshing acidity on the finish.

5) Allende, Rioja, '04, Spain - Inky, minerally, viloet with black fruit. Excellent balance and long finish.

Tempranillo is the premium red wine grape variety from the Rioja and Ribera del Duero region in Spain. Tempranillo's aromas and flavors often combine elements of berryish fruit, herbaceousness, and an earthy-leathery minerality. Being low in acidity and sugar content, it is commonly blended with Carignan (Mazuela), Grenache (Garnacha), Graciano, Merlot and Cabernet Sauvignon.
